

What makes Richmond different?

Our faculty and staff are dedicated to working closely with students in and out of the classroom — and help facilitate opportunities for research, creative projects, and communitybased learning.

What kind of student really thrives here?

Creative risk takers who are motivated more by process (the learning experience) and product (a useful map or geographic tool) than by grades. People who are selfmotivated and work well in groups by pulling their weight and having a healthy respect for diverse ways of knowing and being.

What's the dynamic between you and your students?

I like to find what my students are passionate about and then push them to explore these interests in new and applied ways. I've brought research students to the Peruvian and Brazilian Amazon and took a class to Chile. Two summers ago, five students and I participated in a transboundary mapping workshop in the Peruvian Amazon, working side-by-side with GIS analysts and professors from Brazil and Peru to map human-environment dynamics of the Amazon borderlands.

What do you hope your students take away from your class?

I hope they become life-long learners unafraid to take chances because they know more learning results from the struggle than from the outcome. I hope they become empowered to address climate change and sustainability challenges with a can-do attitude that recognizes there are opportunities to be found in every obstacle. You don't need to know your major, what clubs you want to join, or even who your friend group will be during your first year. The breadth of experiences offered – both inside and outside the classroom — helped me cultivate the ability to think critically and communicate effectively.

Let college be a process of trial and error. This is the one time in your life where you have time, energy, and relatively few responsibilities. Don't waste it creating a boring story.

This place stays with you.

Those who visit our campus often fall in love. They cite the friendly welcome. The open doors. The tree-lined walkways. If you are interested, schedule a tour or register for a virtual admission event.

However you choose to come "see" us, just don't say we didn't warn you. You might decide to stay for the rest of your life.
